Wow! What an exciting first game of the season! A solid team effort against last seasons Vintage inaugural Champions.

Great to finally get on the park for round four. This was our first game after the first two washed out and third cancelled due to 41°C heat.

Well done Garry Winney for getting the team on the park with thanks to new recruit Frank Baliotis for last minute inclusion to make 11 and then a nice surprise with Paul Georgiadis showing up at the ground after we thought he was unavailable. He was much needed too with Jim Robson unable to bowl, injuring his fingers during fielding.

A 22°C overcast day and more humid than a Madras jockstrap! Georges River won the toss and elected to bat on a perfect looking pitch. It played fairly true with the occasional lifter and skidder.

Georges River innings:

Joe Scarcella started us off with an impeccable spell with more maidens than at his first Bachelors and Spinsters ball! Of his seven overs, first was 2 runs then five straight maidens then 1 run and a wicket for only 3 runs in total. Amazing performance! Not to mention Greg Brooks almost taking a sharp low down catch to his right at 1st slip off the third ball. He saved a certain 4 runs. We didn't think he could bend down that far. (In the off season he must have been painting Bron's toe nails!).

Paul Georgiadis took the other end and his first ball was hit hard for 4 but then on his 4th ball Stuart Ridge in his first game in Vintage did a fine pickup and throw from short mid wicket to clean hands David Wright (keeping) for our first wicket – run out. Paul took some early stick but in his 4th over took a sharp caught and bowled to dismiss the other opener. He then bowled their number 4 after being hit for 6 the ball before. A wonderful exhibition of varying pace.

Stuart Ridge replaced Joe Scarcella and off the first ball of his second over, took a spectacular caught and bowled diving to his right. He had another catch dropped at mid-on but kept the pressure on Georges River. Greg Brooks also bowled tightly and was rewarded with a wicket in his sixth and seventh (last) overs. Greg bowled their danger man Remfrey, top of off stump. This really put them on the back foot.

Sittampalam Ragavan ("Raga") continued our tight line and length and clean bowled their number nine and had a catch dropped at deep mid-on. He finished strongly with a maiden (like in the Viking movies).

Garry Winney used flight to keep them guessing and got a sharp caught and bowled and also a chance dropped at short midwicket. Our only catches all caught and bowled. He resorted to faster darts which kept the latter overs score lean. John Mesar chimed in with two economical overs at the end, testing his tender back.

CCNSW innings:

120 to get but we knew we had to bat well with their good attack and a wicket that doesn't really come off the bat.

Peter rolls and Raga opened and got off to a good start with a few boundaries early however both fell in consecutive overs (as happens frequently in cricket) in the fifth and sixth overs.

Garry Winney and Jim Robson ("Jungle") steadied the ship with quick singles until Garry tried to pull a long hop that didn't bounce and was bowled. 'Jungles' soon retired after an immaculate innings. Greg Brooks continued the charge with a 6 into the car park to make those that parked there more nervous than a mouse in a biology class.

Our pace slowed with the stumping of Greg. However, John Mesar and Frank Baliotis advanced us with a couple of boundaries before departing. Stuart ridge and Ross Dalglish had our hearts racing

with quick running between the wickets, scrounging for every run with Ross panting more than a dog on heat! Stuart (59yo youngster) showing his proper English upbringing, was very respectful of age by asking Ross (65yo) while passing in mid-wicket if he was ok for the second run?

Stuart was brilliantly caught and bowled with 3 runs to get. Coincidentally, Georges River only catches were also caught and bowled after dropping a couple in the outfield. Joe Scarcella the man of the hour (and man of the match) got us home next ball with a beautifully clipped leg glance for four.

Winners beers tasted terrific put on by Georges River with good banter from a top bunch of blokes. Like Joe Biden said... *"We may be opponents but we are not enemies"* and we had an enjoyable afternoon together after the game.

VINTAGE ROUND 5 v ASHFIELD DE LA SALLE OLD BOYS AT RON ROUTLEY OVAL ON SUNDAY 10 JANUARY, 2021: REPORT BY PETER ROLLS

Second game of the season and the infamous Nelson strikes twice!

Round 5 and a picture postcard day at Concord with 27°C and a nice nor'easter.

Well done Garry Winney for getting the team on the park for the first game of 2021 although we all looked heavier than a Christmas hamper. Ross Dalglish looked happier than Schapelle Corby after just being freed from the Northern Beaches lockdown. We welcomed Mick McCormick to his first CCNSW Vintage game who turned 60 in November and keener than Joe Biden to take the inauguration! (*Editor's note: players are eligible to play Vintage if they will have turned 58 by 1 April next. They do not have to wait till they are 60*)

CCNSW won the toss and elected to bowl on a pitch with a bit of grass and after all the rain during the week had a thick and lush kikuyu outfield with a big boundary. The wicket played true with the occasional jagger.

Ashfield innings:

Tight bowling from both ends saw batting pressure risk a run on newbie McCormick's arm at mid-wicket with a pick up and throw in one motion to keeper David Wright for our first wicket. Joe Scarcella clean bowled the next batsman with a beautiful in-swinger for us to be on team hat trick (but the new batsman kept out the third ball that was on the stumps).

Joe had an amazing spell with five maidens from his first five overs including a wicket in his third, fourth and fifth overs. Joe had the rhythm of an eighties disco dancer with 3 for 7 off 7 overs. He would have felt right at home at the Concord RSL located next to the oval. The RSL was a hotspot for groovers in the eighties but sadly closed its doors a couple of years ago due to lack of Joes!

Paul Georgiadis was unlucky not to have picked up a wicket in his first over with an attempted cut skied and dropping between Dr. Sittampalam Ragavan ("Raga") and Stuart Ridge (at point and cover respectively). Raga yelled out "*yours*" to Stuart but everyone else yelled out "*Raga*"! Raga later took a sharp catch at point off Stuart's bowling and this time even the umpire called out Raga's name!

Paul bowled 5 straight then came on at the end of Ashfield's innings for his final 2 overs to shut them down for a miserly contribution.

Spring chicken Stuart Ridge (59yo) dived at cover to stop a certain four but ball bounced awkwardly and hit him on the top lip splitting it with claret flowing. Dr Raga was quick on the scene and offered to put a couple of stitches in it as he had needle and thread and local anaesthetic in his bag but Stuart didn't have his Medicare card with him so he decided to soldier on. Brave effort and he didn't even take a break! A couple of overs later Stuart replaced Joe and took a wicket with his third ball caught by Raga (mentioned above). What a medicinal combination for the team!

Mick McCormick found his mojo after one over and was rewarded with a wicket in his fifth over. Jim Robson came on when their hard hitting No. 7, Threlfo, was in full flight and unlucky with a hard hit catch from the other batsman put down at mid-wicket. Garry Winney came on after Mick and came in for some early stick with a massive 6 by Threlfo to help him retire. After that 'Gaz' was economical.

Raga followed Jim Robson for the last three overs from the north end and dropped straight onto a good length first ball and a wicket second ball with a loud snick well taken by David Wright. An lbw in his third over saw superb figures of 2 for 5.

CCNSW innings:

Only 111 to get but we knew we still had to bat well as it was more like 150 would have been on a faster, smaller oval.

Peter Rolls and Raga opened and got off to a good start with quick running as boundaries hard to come by with the thick grass on this massive oval. Peter retired for 30* first and Raga a couple of balls later for 30*. Half way there.

Garry Winney and Frank Baliotis continued the charge until Garry let a yorker through. We think he was glad to take his helmet off. This was the first time he has tried one in readiness for an over 70s tournament where they are mandatory.

Frank Baliotis and Mick McCormick were swift in picking up sharp singles until Mick decided he was puffing too much and needed to go aerial. He was unlucky to be caught on the boundary by what is probably the first boundary catch this season in the Vintage competition. The Ashfield scorer also said he has never seen the fielder take an outfield catch in his life!

Jim Robson ("Jungles") continued the quick running with Frank Baliotis with Jungles calls of "YES" heard at Drummoyne Oval in the next suburb. We were on track for a quick finish until one got through Frank's guard with the score on 106. 6 runs to get with 3 wickets down and 14 overs remaining.

Ross Dalgleish came in hoping to get us over the line as in the last game by starting with a quick single with Jungles (although no such thing as a slow single with Jungles). Unfortunately, Ross was given out LBW on 111 (Nelson). Joe Scarcella strode confidently to the crease expecting to hit a

boundary to win the game like last game. As Joe walked to the wicket Stuart Ridge said to the Captain: "Maybe I should put my creams back on and get padded up?" The Captain hesitantly agreed, thinking no need with 1 run to get. But Nelson again stepped in and Joe was fired out LBW first ball. Ashfield on a hat trick and Stuart still to put boots and pads on and at risk of being timed out. Stuart suggested Paul also to put the pads on in case he is either timed out or fired out.

Stuart hurried out to the wicket like Gladys Berejiklian going to a press conference to explain why she went to Wagga! Two balls later Stuart relieved us with a well timed cover drive to get us home.

Again winners' beers tasted good and the Ashfield team very accommodating and fun to be with on a glorious Sunday afternoon.

Third game of the season and a “Stirling” effort to get us on with 41mm of rain the previous day!

Round 7 and a picturesque country oval with 25°C and a drying south west wind.

Sittampalam Ragavan ('Raga') to the rescue getting some of his Sri Lankan mates, Ashok “Viktor”(Ponnudurai, Ashok Peiris and Ganeshan Vaseeharan to play for us with Garry Winney, David Wright and Ross Dalgleish playing an Over 65 carnival and some others not available.

Frantic phone calls and texts Sunday morning to see if we had to drive the 1.5 hours north to the oval or not with the amount of rain the day before. Full credit to captain Stirling Hamman and a player helper Richard Warren to get the covers off early, soak up a couple of wet spots on the pitch and outfield and rolled the wicket hard to get us a game.

We gathered round Stirling for his pre-match talk and for him to explain the school yard toss of a bat instead of a coin. Hills or Flats was the choice and Peter called Flats. The bat bounced on the ground and landed showing Hills for a split second then rolled over for Flats. We sent them in on a pitch with not much grass but rolled hard. A big boundary and a very damp, slow outfield. The wicket played generally slow and low like usual with the odd ball bouncing high.

Northern Stars innings:

Stuart Ridge opened and was on target from the get-go and rewarded with a wicket in his third over, caught and bowled with a skied hit after their opener lost his patience and tried to pull a just short of a good length delivery. 1 for 6 off five overs. Stuart followed up strategically next over with a gem of a cross seam delivery bowled close to the stumps to take the top of off to dismiss their other opener. Both openers gone after seven overs for just 9 runs. Ajoy Roy commented after the wicket that he also was strategic in that he leaked a single run misfielding backward of square leg to their gun number 3 bat (Evans) so Stuart could take out their second opener. Stuart completed his fifth and final over with another maiden for a miserly total of 4 runs. Well justified for three points man of the match.

Paul Georgiadis opened the other end and he too was very economical bowling five of his seven overs for 6 runs and two overs saved for the end.

Our next wicket came from a direct hit by Peter Rolls from backward of square leg to the striker's end to dismiss Kenny Hall who is always hard to get out. They took a risk due to the tight bowling of Greg Brooks. 3 for 18 after thirteen overs. Greg was rewarded in his seventh and final over hitting top of off to dismiss their number 5 for 13 runs who was starting to accumulate easy singles. 4 for 39 off twenty three overs.

Ashok ("Viktor") Ponnudurai replaced Paul and did a fine job for five overs and saved his two final overs to the end.

Mick McCormick replaced Greg and his off target balls were pounced on by Evans who was looking very solid and pushing up the run rate. Raga replaced Ashok and his variety had them guessing. A wide outswinger made Evans stretch for a cut shot and a bottom edge was brilliantly taken by a diving catch low right by keeper Ashok Peiris. Evans out for 25 was a key scalp and halted their momentum. 5 for 65 off thirty overs.

Mick, sweating up in the humidity like a heifer bull on a reproductive mission, then chimed in with a wicket in his fourth over with an easy catch at cover to Stuart. 6 for 68 off thirty one overs.

Raga's next over saw a dismissal rarely seen at any level of cricket. The batsman's snick was palmed off (attempting a wide catch) by the wicket keeper Ashok to Greg at gully. The batsman could not believe it! 7 for 70 off thirty two overs.

The return of Paul Georgiadis saw instant success with 2 wickets in his sixth over. Danger man Humphries for 27 stumped by Ashok Peiris and incoming batsman cleaned bowled two balls later. 9 for 86 off thirty eight overs.

Ashok Ponnudurai completed his final 2 overs with containing Stirling Hamman and their number 11 to only a couple of runs.

9 for 92 off forty overs. A job well done by all the bowlers but we knew a score on this ground of around 100 is more like 160 on a normal ground so we would have to be diligent.

CCNSW innings:

Raga and Ajoy Roy opened and were greeted with tight bowling; however they managed to keep the scoreboard ticking over at the required run rate of 2.3 per over for seven overs. Then in the eighth over it all changed quickly with Raga caught behind and Ganeshan Vaseeharan caught at point the next ball. 2 for 14 off eight overs.

Ajoy followed two overs later when run out from a fine throw to the keeper from a deepish mid-on. Jim Robson ("Jungles") and Peter Rolls showed some quick running between wickets to keep us moving in the right direction.

Enter Kenny Hall with his left arm off-spin darts. With decades of 1st grade cricket for this wily coyote, he knew every trick in the book including more chat than Shane Warne. Some turning square with bounce on a flat track...amazing bowling! Jungles and Peter knew we had to keep Kenny out or he could rip threw us. So we took our chances against the bowling at the other end with success. We absorbed Kenny's spell and he ended with figures of 0 for 3 off 7 overs with 5 maidens. Peter retired the next over for 30* and Jungle two overs later for 31*. 3 for 67 off twenty six overs with still 26 runs to get in fourteen overs.

Mick McCormick and Greg Brooks made short work of the remaining 26 runs with Greg (sponsored by NASA) launching two balls into orbit for 6 over mid-on. Job done in under 33 overs. Not often that we get a win at Mandalong. Well done lads!

Stirling entertained us with his after match summary speech. He also produced from an old cupboard, a silver plate in a woodern frame covered in cobwebs. A memorial created in 2005 for John McDonald – our former Masters' captain and a legend of the CCNSW club (*Ed note: after whom the 'John McDonald Medal' is named*) who sadly passed away from cancer on 28 April 2005 at age 47. He would have been 63 this April and playing with us in Vintage cricket.

A sobering thought that we are grateful to still be playing this great game.

The Hunter lads made the 2.5 hour trip after many phone calls the day before, not wanting to make the trip if the ground was going to be unplayable. To their delight we got a game on a decent pitch with a bit of grass and some bounce for the quicker bowlers. David Wright also made the trip down from Newcastle where he was planning a relaxing weekend at his mother's place trying to rest his injured knee before our SOS went out when we could not get a replacement keeper. Such is the strength of this team man to help his comrades out and did an amazing job on one leg...and with no byes! A highlight of the season.
